On that day a great persecution broke out against the church in Jerusalem, and all except the apostles were scattered throughout Judea and Samaria. Godly men buried Stephen and mourned deeply for him. But Saul began to destroy the church. Going from house to house, he dragged off both men and women and put them in prison. Those who had been scattered preached the word wherever they went. Acts 8:1-4

It has always amazed me how God has a way of turning things around – of bringing good out of evil; achieving his purposes despite the evil intentions of men.

Think about these examples:

- Saul, persecutor of Christians, is converted and becomes the Apostle Paul,
 writer of half the New Testament!

- Jesus, betrayed and crucified, and thereby bringing salvation to all who would believe!

Persecution is to be expected, and it was through persecution that the believers spread out to new areas and evangelised. God is in the business of turning the evil intentions of men into good.






particularly in those who don't see their grandparents; one such student asked at the end of the Wontama visit, 'Could we come back?' It's a great camp. Thanks again to those who helped.
