Teaching and Learning

Think about the last time you learnt something new. Perhaps during Lockdown you tried to learn to speak Spanish. Maybe you watched a youtube clip about how to make a dovetail joint. How did you go with it? We have a much better understanding about the learning process, and this informs our teaching practice, often referred to as the Science of Learning.

One principle is to 'present new material using small steps' and ensure there is opportunity to practise each step. I often say to my students, when you learn something new, make sure you do it again and again to build automaticity and fluency.
