



Year 12 Farewell Assembly will take place on Friday 22nd September in the Hall. Please join us as we celebrate Year 12.



Hasn't the lovely warmer weather been so embracing and delightful? With the change in seasons comes a change to summer uniform commencing from Week 1, Term 4 Monday 14th October.

Please be reminded that all students are expected to adhere to the following guidelines for full summer uniform ensuring they are neatly presented:

- Socks All boys must wear grey
 crew socks at least ankle height,
 primary girls must wear navy crew
 length socks, secondary girls must
 wear navy crew length socks.
- Ties Primary girls must wear a navy tab tie and all Secondary boys Year 7-12 must wear a school tie.

- Years 11 & 12 boys must wear trousers (no shorts) and tie whilst girls must wear calf length tartan skirt and tartan tab tie.
- Hats & Caps Students must wear
 a school bucket hat (Primary) or
 school cap (Secondary). A reminder
 that we have a NO HAT, PLAY IN
 THE SHADE policy in place for
