There is a lot of research (and speculation) as to what makes schools a success for students in terms of academics, and in their sense of wellbeing and belonging. One such well-researched report commissioned by the Federal Government titled "Report of the review to achieve educational excellence in Australian Schools" (2018) (Through Growth to Achievement: Report of the Review to Achieve Educational Excellence in Australian Schools – Department of Education, Australian Government) made 23 recommendations.

Not surprisingly, several recommendations pointed to parents and carers needing to have direct input and engagement with their child's schooling. The rationale for this was simple, parents who engage with their child's schooling develop a strong team approach which benefits their child through the rigours of academics, and guiding adolescent development.

When school and parents work together, they can have a profound impact as they can complement each other (not supplement) key factors such as biblical truth, learning, boundaries, and developing Godly character.

When schools and parents do not work together, mixed messages are given which could complicate a child's sense of belonging and achieving academic success. Input from all three factors (schools, parents and students), all equally play a part in student success at school.

### **Secondary School**




