As we farewelled our Year 12 Graduates last week, I encouraged them to really think deeply about their calling (vocation). If your goal in life is simply to earn enough money to be comfortable, or to have personal enjoyment, and you don't pursue a more meaningful vocation, you will miss out on the richness that is possible.

About 5 years ago a research company by the name of Cardus conducted a survey of almost 5000 young Millenials in Australia, around 10 years after they had graduated from high school. The results from graduates of Christian schools were strikingly different from those who had been educated in other sectors. Christian school graduates were more likely to report academic success at University, a sense of meaning and purpose in life, and an ability to deal positively with personal relationships. They were more likely to get married, and stay married. Christian school graduates were the most involved in volunteering and giving –not just in religious organisations, but also charities, political parties and environmental organisations. Christian school graduates contribute more because, knowing they were created by God for a purpose, they are more likely to develop a sense of vocation that extends beyond themselves.

2023 has seen all Stage 4 students learn about Food Waste in Technology Mandatory. This unit of work reminded us that in Genesis 1:31 we are told "And God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good." In Leviticus 25: 1-7 we are reminded "the land itself must be given rest and not abused.". It is an important lesson for our students to value the gifts of food and move forward without wasting it. Students embraced the idea that they could be creative changemakers within the classroom then transfer those skills to home. Learning about the difference between best before date and expiry dates to being creative with leftovers, students were on a mission for change. Their assessment was to design a recipe and make that dish or drink that used up any of the 5 most commonly wasted foods: Bread, Fruit, Vegetables, Leftovers and Bagged Salads. The results for this new task – simply spectacular – you be the judge.
